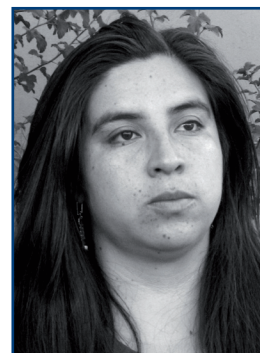

THE LECTURERS

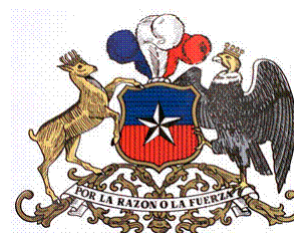
